

Direction No. 1 of the Civil Contingencies Authority given under the Emergency Provisions (Coronavirus) (General Provision) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No.10) Regulations, 2021

In accordance with the provisions of regulation 19(5) of the Emergency Provisions (Coronavirus) (General Provision) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No.10) Regulations, 2021 ("**the (No.10) Regulations**"), the Civil Contingencies Authority gives the following direction:

Interpretation

1. For the purposes of this Direction:
 - (a) any reference to a regulation in this Direction is a reference to a regulation of the (No. 10) Regulations; and
 - (b) words and expressions used in this Direction have the same meanings as in the (No. 10) Regulations; and
 - (c) "relevant scheme" means a scheme provided or approved by -
 - (i) the UK Defence Medical Services,
 - (ii) the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office, or
 - (iii) the United Nations, for the purposes of the vaccination of its officers and staff.

Specified categories of person

2. The following categories of person shall be treated as having a full vaccination history for the purposes of these Regulations where that person provides sufficient evidence to satisfy the appointed officer that he or she falls within one of the categories below:

Administration of vaccine in jurisdiction(s) not falling within regulation 19(4)(a) (regulation 19(5)(a))

- (a) any person who holds an official proof of vaccination certificate issued by a jurisdiction falling within regulation 19(4)(a) (or such other official evidence issued in relation to a full course of a UK certified vaccine administered under a relevant scheme) on the basis that that person has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine in any jurisdiction, or a combination of jurisdictions, not falling within regulation 19(4)(a);
- (b) any person who holds an official proof of vaccination certificate issued by a jurisdiction falling within regulation 19(4)(a) on the basis that that person –
 - (i) has received a single dose of a UK certified vaccine in a jurisdiction falling within regulation 19(4)(a), but
 - (ii) is not considered eligible to receive a second dose of such a vaccine on the basis that that person has previously been infected by Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2;
- (c) any person who is ordinarily resident in the Bailiwick of Guernsey and has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine in any jurisdiction, or a combination of jurisdictions, not falling within regulation 19(4)(a); and
- (d) any person who arrives in the Bailiwick of Guernsey for the purpose of becoming ordinarily resident and has received their full course of a UK certified vaccine in any jurisdiction, or a combination of jurisdictions, not falling within regulation 19(4)(a).

Administration of vaccine in different jurisdictions (regulation 19(5)(b))

- (e) for the avoidance of doubt, any person who is ordinarily resident in the Bailiwick of Guernsey and has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine where each dose was administered in a different jurisdiction which both fall within regulation 19(4)(a);

- (f) for the avoidance of doubt, any person who arrives in the Bailiwick of Guernsey for the purpose of becoming ordinarily resident and has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine where each dose was administered in a different jurisdiction which both fall within regulation 19(4)(a);
- (g) any person who is ordinarily resident in the Bailiwick of Guernsey and has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine where each dose was administered in a different jurisdiction, one of which falls within regulation 19(4)(a) whilst the other jurisdiction does not;
- (h) any person who arrives in the Bailiwick of Guernsey for the purpose of becoming ordinarily resident and has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine where each dose was administered in a different jurisdiction, one of which falls within regulation 19(4)(a) whilst the other jurisdiction does not;
- (i) any person who is ordinarily resident in the Bailiwick of Guernsey and has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine where each dose was administered in a different jurisdiction, neither of which fall within regulation 19(4)(a); and
- (j) any person who arrives in the Bailiwick of Guernsey for the purpose of becoming ordinarily resident and has received a full course of a UK certified vaccine where each dose was administered in a different jurisdiction, neither of which fall within regulation 19(4)(a).

Revocation

3. For the avoidance of doubt, on the coming into force of this Direction, Direction No. 1 and Direction No. 2 made under the Emergency Provisions (Coronavirus) (General Provision) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No.9) Regulations, 2021 shall cease to have effect.

Commencement

4. This Direction shall come into force when it is published on the States of Guernsey website.

This Direction consolidates and replaces Direction No. 1 and Direction No. 2 of the Civil Contingencies Authority, made under the Emergency Provisions (Coronavirus) (General Provision) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No.9) Regulations, 2021 ("the (No. 9) Regulations"). Those Directions continued to have effect following the revocation of the (No. 9) Regulations by the (No. 10) Regulations by virtue of regulation 25 (revocation and savings) of the (No. 10) Regulations.
