ENTITLED

THE MAGISTRATE'S COURT FEES RULES, 1962

THE ROYAL COURT, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section twenty-five of the Magistrate's Court (Guernsey) Law, 1954, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, hereby orders:—

1. (1) There shall be paid in respect of the proceedings in the Magistrate's Court (hereafter in these Rules referred to as "the Court") described in the

first column of the Schedule to this Order and in respect of the matters connected with such proceedings described in that column of that Schedule the respective fees set out in the second column of that Schedule.

(2) Any such fee shall be paid to the Court, Her Majesty's Greffier, Her Majesty's Sergeant or Her Majesty's Sheriff, as the case may be, as specified in the third column of the Schedule to this Order opposite the reference to such fee in the second column of that Schedule.

Allowances
to witnesses.

2. (1) The Magistrate may order—

- (a) any person convicted of any offence in any criminal proceedings in the Court;
- (b) any party to any civil proceedings in the Court;

to pay to any person attending the Court to give evidence in those proceedings, including, in the case of civil proceedings, any party thereto, an allowance calculated at a rate not exceeding fifteen shillings for each half-day during which the attendance of that person was required at the Court.

(2) Any allowance under this Rule may be ordered to be paid to any person attending the Court to give evidence as a witness notwithstanding that such person was not called to give evidence and, if such person had not been summoned to attend the Court, notwithstanding that such person had not been so summoned.

Saving.

3. Nothing in these Rules contained shall apply to or in relation to any proceedings in the Court commenced before the coming into force of these Rules or in respect of any matter connected with such proceedings.

4. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Magistrate's Court Fees Rules, 1962. Citation and commencement.

(2) These Rules shall come into force on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and sixty-two.
