## **The Royal Court (Arbitration) (Guernsey) Rules, 1983**

THE ROYAL COURT, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section forty of the Arbitration (Guernsey) Law, 1982(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (3) and (4) of these Rules, every application to the Court under the Law shall be made by filing a notice of application with Her Majesty's Greffier

and serving a copy of the notice within the seven days next following the filing thereof on every party affected by the application.

(2) When a date has been fixed for the hearing by the Court of an application to which the last preceding paragraph applies, Her Majesty's Greffier shall inform the applicant of the date so fixed and notice thereof shall, as soon as may be, be served by the applicant on every other party affected by the application and shall in any case be so served not less than four clear days before the date so fixed.

(3) Every application to the Court under section nineteen, section twenty, section twenty-one, subsection (1) of section twenty-two, subsections (1) and (2) of section twenty-three and twenty-six (including applications under the said section twenty-six as extended by sections thirty-two and thirty-seven) of the Law shall be made by way of summons which shall be served on every party affected by the application.

(4) An application to the Court under subsection (4) of section eleven of the Law may be made ex parte.

(5) Every application to the Court shall state in general terms the grounds of the application.

Interpreta-  
tion.

2. (1) In these Rules the expression "the Law" means the Arbitration (Guernsey) Law, 1982, and any other expressions have the same meanings as in the Law.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948(b), shall apply to the interpretation of these Rules as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

(3) Any reference in these Rules to any other enactment shall, except where the context otherwise requires, be construed as including a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed or replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Rules.

3. These Rules may be cited as the Royal Court Citation. (Arbitration) (Guernsey) Rules, 1983.

4. These Rules shall come into force on the eleventh day of April, nineteen hundred and eighty-three. **Commence-  
ment.**
