No. 3 ORDER, 1949,

ENTITLED

“PROCEDURE FOR PERMITTING SUBSTITUTED OR
OTHER SERVICE, OR FOR NOTICE INSTEAD
OF SERVICE, IN CERTAIN CASES”.

1. When service of any legal process in the manner required by law would, but for the provisions of this Order, be impracticable or would entail undue expense, the Court may make such order for substituted or other service, or for the

substitution for service of notice, by advertisement or otherwise, as may be just. Any such order may provide that any person upon whom such substituted or other service is made, or to whom such notice is given, shall be bound by any judgment, order or decision in the proceedings with respect to which substituted or other service is made or such notice is given, even though he shall not have entered an appearance in respect of such service or notice.

2. In this Order the expression "the Court" shall mean the Royal Court sitting as a Full Court or the Royal Court sitting as an Ordinary Court.
