ORDER OF THE ROYAL COURT MADE IN
PURSUANCE OF THE SUPPLIES AND SER-
VICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (GUERNSEY)
ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1946,

ENTITLED

**The Defence Regulation 62 (Variation to
extend to Alderney) Order, 1951.**

THE ROYAL COURT, in exercise of the powers
conferred on it by virtue of the Supplies and Services
(Transitional Powers) (Guernsey) Order in Council,

1946, and in pursuance of Article 64 of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, hereby orders:—

1. Regulation 62 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945 (which relates to the control of cultivation) is hereby varied as follows:—

- (a) in paragraph (1) for the words “Island of Guernsey” there shall be substituted the words “Islands of Guernsey and Alderney”;
- (b) in paragraph (2) for the words “the Royal Court and includes such other person or persons as the Royal Court may designate” there shall be substituted the words “the States Legislation Committee and includes any person or persons designated by the Royal Court before the day following the date of the holding of the Chief Pleas after Christmas, 1948 (on which date the Royal Court ceased to be a Competent Authority under any Defence Regulation), and any person or persons designated or to be designated by the States Legislation Committee”.

2. A copy of this Order shall be transmitted by His Majesty's Greffier to the Court of Alderney for registration on the Records of that Island.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 10th day of December, 1951.
