Regulations, 1945.**

ORDER OF THE ROYAL COURT MADE IN
PURSUANCE OF THE SUPPLIES AND SER-
VICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (GUERNSEY)
ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1946,

ENTITLED

**The Defence (General) (Guernsey)
Regulations, 1945, Amendment (No. 1)
Order, 1955.**

The Royal Court, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Guernsey) Order in Council,

1946, and in pursuance of Article sixty-four of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, hereby orders:—

1. The following Regulations of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, are hereby revoked, namely:—

Number of Regulation	Subject Matter
53	Requisitioning of property other than land.
88A	Entry and search of premises, etc., to obtain evidence of offences.

2. (1) The power conferred by paragraph (1) of Regulation fifty-five of the said Regulations (which relates to the general control of industry) to make orders for the purposes described in sub-paragraph (a) of that paragraph shall cease to be exercisable except as follows, that is to say:—

(a) for making such provision, otherwise than for controlling the prices at which electricity and the following articles may be sold and the charges which may be made for the hire of such articles and for labour, services or goods provided in connection with the hire thereof, as is mentioned in the said sub-paragraph (a) in relation to electricity and to the following articles, that is to say:—

paper;
 hemp (manila);
 coal, coke and other similar fuels;
 tin plate, terne plate and black plate;
 iron and steel scrap;
 cattle, sheep, pigs, milk, eggs and potatoes;
 bread, flour and welfare foods; and

(b) for imposing in respect of the movement, transport, disposal or acquisition of any articles situated outside the Bailiwick of Guernsey, or the re-export of any articles from the Bailiwick of Guernsey, or in respect of the construction of ships, such prohibitions or restrictions as appear to the Competent Authority to be expedient having regard to any agreement or arrangement concluded in respect of defence matters, or any consultations held in respect of such matters, between Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the government of any country outside the United Kingdom; and

(c) for controlling the prices at which the following articles may be sold and the charges which may be made for the hire of such articles and for labour, services or goods provided in connection with the hire thereof, that is to say:—

coal, coke and other similar fuels;
 iron and steel scrap;
 potatoes;
 milk, bread and welfare foods;
 medical supplies;

and accordingly the said sub-paragraph (a) is hereby revoked so far as it authorises the making of orders for purposes other than the purposes aforesaid.

(2) The following further provisions of the said Regulation fifty-five are hereby revoked, namely:—

(a) in paragraph (1), sub-paragraph (b) and the words "and either to the whole or to any part of any undertaking";

(b) in paragraph (6), the definition of "essential work" and the words "and also as including a reference to electricity".

3. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“medical supplies” includes surgical, dental and optical materials and equipment;

“paper” includes all descriptions (whether laminated or coated or not) of paper, paper board and pulp board;

“welfare foods” means dried milk, concentrated orange juice, cod liver oil and vitamin tablets.

4. Copies of this Order shall be transmitted by Her Majesty’s Greffier to the Court of Alderney and the Seneschal of Sark for registration on the respective records of those Islands.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the 12th day of February, nineteen hundred and fifty-five.
