

ORDER OF THE ROYAL COURT MADE IN
PURSUANCE OF THE SUPPLIES AND
SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(GUERNSEY) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1946,

ENTITLED

**The Defence (General) (Guernsey)
Regulations, 1945, Amendment (No. 3)
Order, 1953.**

The Royal Court, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Guernsey) Order in Council, 1946, and

in pursuance of Article 64 of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, hereby orders:—

1. The following Regulations of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, are hereby revoked, namely:—

<i>Number of Regulation</i>	<i>Subject Matter</i>
54	Special powers as to ships and aircraft.
77	Inquiries.
89	Use of force in entering premises.
94	Disposal of articles in possession of executive authorities.
95	Recovery of expenses.
96	Entrusting of functions to statutory bodies.

2. The following provisions and words in Regulation fifty-five of the said Regulations are hereby revoked, namely:—

- (a) paragraph (1B) (which penalises persons who steal controlled articles within the meaning of that Regulation or receive such articles knowing them to have been stolen);
- (b) in paragraph (1D) (which imposes special penalties for offences against the said paragraph (1B) and certain other offences), the words “(1B) or”; and
- (c) in paragraph (6), the definition of “controlled article”.

3. Copies of this Order shall be transmitted by Her Majesty's Greffier to the Court of Alderney and the Seneschal of Sark for registration on the respective Records of those Islands.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of October, 1953.
