**The Defence (General) (Guernsey)
Regulations, 1945.**

ORDER OF THE ROYAL COURT MADE IN
PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE 2 OF THE
EMERGENCY LAWS (MISCELLANEOUS PRO-
VISIONS) (GUERNSEY) ORDER IN COUNCIL,
1952,

ENTITLED

**The Emergency Laws (Miscellaneous
Provisions Continuance) (Bailiwick of
Guernsey) Order, 1952.**

THE ROYAL COURT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Emergency Laws (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Guernsey) Order in Council, 1952, and in

pursuance of Article 64 of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, hereby orders:—

1. This Order shall have effect throughout the Bailiwick of Guernsey and the territorial waters adjacent to any part thereof, and a copy of this Order shall be transmitted by Her Majesty's Greffier to the Court of Alderney and to the Seneschal of Sark for registration on the respective Records of those Islands.

2. (1) The Defence Regulations set out in the Schedule to this Order (being Defence Regulations in force on the fourth day of December, 1952, the date of the making of the Emergency Laws (Continuance) Order, 1952), shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until the tenth day of December, 1953.

(2) Section 19 of the Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply upon the expiry or earlier revocation of any Defence Regulation continued in force by this Order as if that Regulation were an enactment and had then been repealed.

(3) The references in subsection (1) of this section to the Defence Regulations therein referred to shall be construed as references to those Regulations as in force at the date of this Order.

3. (1) Section 3 of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, as extended by the Emergency Powers (Guernsey) Order in Council, 1945, (which relates to the extra-territorial operation of Defence Regulations), shall, notwithstanding the expiry of the said Act, as so extended, continue to apply, as far as applicable, to any Defence Regulations continued in force by section 2 of this Order.

(2) Section 7 of the said Act as so extended (which relates to the proof of instruments) shall, notwithstanding the expiry of the said Act as so extended, continue to apply in relation to instruments made or

issued in pursuance of any provisions contained in, or having effect under, any Defence Regulation continued in force by section 2 of this Order, and documents purporting to be such instruments.

4. Where any Regulation continued in force by section 2 of this Order also has effect by virtue of an Order made in pursuance of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Guernsey) Order in Council, 1946, nothing in the said section shall affect the operation of that Regulation for the purposes of the said Order, and nothing in the said Order or done thereunder shall affect the operation of that Regulation under this Order.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, 1952.
