ORDER OF THE ROYAL COURT MADE IN
PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE 2 OF THE
EMERGENCY LAWS (MISCELLANEOUS PRO-
VISIONS) (GUERNSEY) ORDER IN COUNCIL,
1952,

**The Defence (General) (Guernsey)
Regulations, 1945, Amendment (No. 2)
Order, 1952.**

THE ROYAL COURT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Emergency Laws (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Guernsey) Order in Council, 1952, and in

pursuance of Article 64 of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, hereby orders:—

1. In paragraph (1) of Regulation ninety of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945 (which penalises a person who attempts to commit, conspires with another to commit or does any act preparatory to the commission of an offence against any of those Regulations) the words “or does any act preparatory to the commission of” are hereby revoked.

2. The following provisions of Regulation one hundred of the said Regulations (which, by reason of the revocation of the provisions of other Regulations, have become of no effect) are hereby revoked, namely:—

(a) in paragraph (1), the definitions of “the enemy”, “enemy alien”, “prisoner of war”, “protected place”, “road vehicle”, “sea-plane”, “wireless transmitting apparatus”, and “wireless receiving apparatus”; and

(b) paragraph (1A) and (4).

3. Copies of this Order shall be transmitted by Her Majesty's Greffier to the Court of Alderney and the Seneschal of Sark for registration on the respective Records of those Islands.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, 1952.
