ENTITLED

The Court of Alderney (Robes) Order, 1955.

THE ROYAL COURT, in pursuance of Article 64 of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, orders as follows :—

1. The Chairman and Jurats of the Court of Alderney, when sitting judicially in the Court of Alderney, and the Clerk of the Court of Alderney and any person acting lawfully in the place of the Clerk of the Court of Alderney, when carrying out at a sitting of the Court of Alderney the duties of Clerk of that

Court, shall, except on such occasions as it shall be decided otherwise by that Court, respectively wear the dress hereinafter prescribed.

2. (1) The dress of the Chairman shall be—

- (a) a very dark blue cloth robe of the style worn by the Jurats of the Royal Court of Guernsey, with facings of shot ruby silk;
- (b) white bands; and
- (c) a head-dress of very dark blue cloth of the style worn by the Jurats of the Royal Court of Guernsey.

(2) The dress of the Jurats shall be—

- (a) a dark blue cloth robe of the style aforesaid but with facings of light lilac silk;
- (b) white bands; and
- (c) (i) in the case of male Jurats, a head-dress of dark blue cloth of the style to be worn by the Chairman; and
- (ii) in the case of female Jurats, a head-dress of the same coloured cloth but differing from that of the male Jurats by having a slightly smaller and lower crown without the padded pleating above the headband.

(3) The dress of the Clerk of the Court and of a person acting in his place shall be—

- (a) a plain black stuff robe of the style worn by Her Majesty's Greffier in the Island of Guernsey;
- (b) white bands; and
- (c) a head-dress of black cloth of the style worn by Her Majesty's Greffier aforesaid.

3. In this Order, the expression "the Chairman" means the Jurat of the Court of Alderney for the time being designated by the Secretary of State as Chairman of that Court.

4. A copy of this Order shall be transmitted by Her Majesty's Greffier to the Clerk of the Court of Alderney for registration on the Records of that Court.
