**The Social Insurance (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit)

**THE GUERNSEY SOCIAL SECURITY AUTHORITY**, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 20 of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1978, as amended<sup>a</sup>, hereby orders:-

**Amendment**

1. Paragraphs (2) and (3) of Regulation 2 of the Social Insurance (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1978, as amended<sup>b</sup>, are repealed and paragraph (4) is renumbered as paragraph (2).

**Citation**

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) (Amendment) Regulations, 1999.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)  
These Regulations form part of a process to streamline the administration of benefit payments, deleting a provision which, in restricted circumstances, allowed contributions of an inappropriate class to increase benefit entitlement. This rarely invoked provision generated administrative complexities without producing significant benefit to those it was intended to assist.
