The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1984

Made the 18th day of June, 1984.

Coming into operation on the 22nd day of June, 1984.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating vehicular traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal, shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along that portion of Guelles Lane, Saint Peter Port which lies between a traffic sign placed as near as possible to the eastern entrance to the premises of M G Flouquet and Sons Limited and Guelles Road, otherwise than from east to west.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force;

"traffic sign" has the meaning assigned to that expression in section one of The Vehicular Traffic (Traffic Signs) Ordinance, 1961 (c).

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1984.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the twenty-second day of June, nineteen hundred and eighty-four and shall continue in force until the seventeenth day of December, nineteen hundred and eighty-four.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that from 22nd June 1984 to 17th December 1984, the western end of Guelles Lane, from the end of the premises of Eurotherm (Guernsey) Ltd to its junction with Guelles Road, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed from the direction of Mont Arrivé towards Guelles Road. The portion of Guelles lane between Eurotherm (Guernsey) Ltd and Mont Arrivé will remain a two-way street.
