GUERNSEY STATUTORY INSTRUMENT 2004 No 13

THE POLICE POWERS AND CRIMINAL EVIDENCE (CODES OF PRACTICE) (BAILIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 2004

Made: 15th March, 2004
Coming into force: 5th April, 2004
Laid before the States: 26th May, 2004

THE COMMITTEE FOR HOME AFFAIRS and THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION, in exercise of powers conferred upon them by Section 74 of The Police Powers and Criminal Evidence (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2003¹ ("the Law"), hereby order: -

1. The following codes of practice –
 - (i) A ("code of practice for the exercise by police officers of statutory powers to stop and search"),
 - (ii) B ("code of practice for searches of premises by police officers and the seizure of property found by police officers on persons or premises"),
 - (iii) C ("code of practice for detention, treatment and questioning of persons by police officers"),
 - (iv) D ("code of practice for the identification of persons by police officers"), and
 - (v) E ("code of practice for the tape recording of interviews with suspects"),

issued under section 73 of the Law by the Committee for Home Affairs in relation to police officers and by the Board of Administration in relation to Customs Officers are hereby brought into operation.

2. This Order may be cited as The Police Powers and Criminal Evidence (Codes of Practice) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 2004, and shall come into force on the 5th April 2004.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

As from 5th April 2004 this Order brings into effect the codes of practice issued in relation to police officers and customs officers in accordance with the Police Powers and Criminal Evidence (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2003.
