THE PREVENTION OF TERRORISM (SUPPLEMENTAL TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) (AMENDMENT) (GUERNSEY) ORDER 1977

Made 27th April, 1977
Laid before the States 1977
Coming into Operation 27th April, 1977

THE STATES EMERGENCY COUNCIL, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 13 and 14 (5) and (6) of and paragraph 1 (7) and (8) of Schedule 3 to the Prevention of Terrorism (Temporary Provisions) Act 1976 as extended to the Bailiwick by the Prevention of Terrorism (Temporary Provisions) Act 1976 (Guernsey) Order 1976, hereby order:-
Citation and commencement.

1. This Order may be cited as the Prevention of Terrorism (Supplemental Temporary Provisions) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Order 1977 and shall come into operation on the 27th April, 1977.

Amendment to Order of 1976.

2. Article 13 of the Prevention of Terrorism (Supplemental Temporary Provisions) Order 1976(a) (requirements with respect to embarkation and disembarkation of passengers and crew) shall have effect subject to the following amendments, that is to say -

- (a) in paragraphs (1)(a) and (2), the words and commas ", if required to do so by an examining officer," shall be omitted;
- (b) in paragraph (3), for the words "if so required by an examining officer" there shall be substituted the words "and subject to paragraph (5)";
- (c) in paragraph (4), the words "(subject to paragraph (5))" shall be omitted;
- (d) for paragraph (5) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:-

"(5) An examining officer may dispense with all, or any, of the requirements of paragraph (4) either generally

or in respect of such classes of persons as he may specify."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order amends Article 13 of the Prevention of Terrorism (Supplemental Temporary Provisions) Order 1976 which imposes requirements on captains of ships and aircraft arriving in the Bailiwick from Great Britain, the Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland, Jersey or the Isle of Man or going from the Bailiwick to any of those places in connection with the examination of persons embarking and disembarking.

Under Article 13, as amended by this Order, it will no longer be necessary for an examining officer to require the captain to comply with the requirements in the Article for those requirements to apply. Instead, those requirements will automatically apply unless (in the case of the obligation in Article 13 (4) to supply particulars of the passengers and crew) they are wholly or partly dispensed with by the examining officer.
