The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 2)
Regulations, 1974

Made the 7th day of May, 1974.

Coming into operation on the 10th day of May, 1974.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along:-

- (a) Ville ès Pies Lane, Vale, from its junction with Rue des Petites Hougues to its junction with Rue de l'Ecole, otherwise than from south to north;
- (b) Rue de l'Ecole, Vale, from its junction with Ville ès Pies Lane to its junction with Hougue Ricart, otherwise than from east to west;
- (c) Hougue Ricart, Vale, otherwise than from north to south.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1974.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the tenth day of May, nineteen hundred and seventy-four, and shall continue in force until the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and seventy-four.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the 10th May, 1974:-

- (a) that portion of Ville `s Pies Lane, Vale, from its junction with Rue des Petites Hougues to its junction with Rue de l'Ecole, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to travel in the direction of Rue de l'Ecole;
- (b) Rue de l'Ecole, Vale, from its junction with Ville `s Pies Lane to its junction with Hougue Ricart, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to travel in the direction of Hougue Ricart;
- (c) Hougue Ricart, Vale, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to travel in the direction of its junction with Croix du Bois Road and Belval Road.
