The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 2)  
Regulations, 1983

Made the 10th day of June, 1983

Coming into operation on the 17th day of June, 1983.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle of an overall width of six feet or more shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive that vehicle on or along that portion of Contrée Mansell, Saint Peter Port which lies between a sign marked "NO ENTRY FOR VEHICLES 6 FEET WIDE OR MORE" placed by the Island Police Committee near its junction with Mansell Street and its junction with Mansell Court, being a portion of the public highway set out in paragraph 77 of Part I of the Second Schedule to the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970(c), and in respect of which the provisions of paragraph (b) of section one of that Ordinance apply.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No. 2) Regulations, 1983.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the tenth day of June, nineteen hundred and eighty-three and shall continue in force until the ninth day of December, nineteen hundred and eighty-three.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

Contrée Mansell, Saint Peter Port, is a designated one-way street requiring traffic to proceed from the direction of its junction with Mansell Street towards its junction with Vauvert and the effect of these Regulations is that, in addition to the one-way street requirement, for a period of six months from the 10th June, 1983, vehicles of an overall width of 6 feet or more are not permitted to use the portion of Contrée Mansell which lies between a traffic sign placed near its junction with Mansell Street and its junction with Mansell Court.
