THE SOCIAL SECURITY DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 15 and 35 of the Health Service (Benefit) (Guernsey) Law, 1990, as amended¹, hereby orders:-

Amendment

1. For Part II of the First Schedule to the Health Service (Medical Appliances) Regulations, 1990, as amended², substitute the Schedule set out in these Regulations.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 applies to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

Citation

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Health Service (Medical Appliances) (Amendment) Regulations, 2006.

Commencement

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the 19th day of April 2006.

Regulation 1

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Part II	
Sterile hypodermic needles for single use.	For use with “NovoPen”
Hypodermic needles and syringes.	In accordance with appropriate provisions of the Drug Tariff or in accordance with specifications laid down by the Authority.
Lancets. Urine sugar analysis sets (Clinitest). Ring pessaries	In accordance with appropriate provisions of the Drug Tariff.

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EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport)

These Regulations further amend the Health Service (Medical Appliances) Regulations, 1990, as amended, by allowing ring pessaries to be prescribed as a medical appliance.
