THE IMMIGRATION (CONTROL OF ENTRY THROUGH REPUBLIC OF IRELAND) (AMENDMENT)
(GUERNSEY) ORDER 1979

Made 26 July 1979

Coming into operation 1 August 1979

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 9(6) and section 32 of the Immigration Act 1971(a) as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order 1972(b), I hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Order 1979 and shall come into operation on 1 August 1979.
2. In Article 3(1)(b)(iii) of the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland) (Guernsey) (No 1) Order 1972(c), for the words 'provided that' there shall be substituted the words 'or, if he had a limited leave to enter or remain there, after the expiry of the leave, provided that in either case'.

Explanatory Note

(This note is not part of the Order)

Article 3 of the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland) (Guernsey) (No 1) Order 1972 excludes from the operation of section 1(3) of the Immigration Act 1971 as extended to this Bailiwick, (which exempts from control passengers travelling on local journeys within the common travel area, that is to say the area comprising the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and the Republic of Ireland) inter alia persons who entered the Republic of Ireland from the Bailiwick of Guernsey after entering there unlawfully. This Order amends Article 3 so as to exclude also from the operation of Section 1(3) persons who entered the Republic from the Bailiwick of Guernsey after over-staying their leave.
