THE CHRYSANTHEMUM (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION ON LANDING) ORDER, 1981.

Made 19th January, 1981
Laid before the States
Coming into Operation 23rd January, 1981

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR HORTICULTURE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by subsection (1) of section eight of the Importation of Plants and Plant Produce (Health) Ordinance, 1972 (a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

1. The landing in this Island of pot plants or cut flowers of florists' chrysanthemum (species, hybrids and cultivars of *Dendranthema* (DC) (Desmoul) grown in the Netherlands is hereby prohibited
2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, any expression has the same meaning as in the Importation of Plants and Plant Produce (Health) Ordinance, 1972.
3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 (b), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
4. This order may be cited as the Chrysanthemum (Temporary Prohibition on Landing) order, 1981.
5. This Order shall come into force on the twenty-third day of January, nineteen hundred and eighty one and shall cease to have effect on the seventeenth day of March, nineteen hundred and eighty one.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

The purpose of this Order is to prohibit for about two months from the 23rd January, 1961, the landing in the Island of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou of pot plants and cut flowers of chrysanthemums grown in the Netherlands.
