TRANSPORT & FISHERIES COMMITTEE - PUBLIC VEHICLE REGULATIONS

The STATES OF ALDERNEY TRANSPORT & FISHERIES COMMITTEE in pursuance of powers vested in it by Section II of The Alderney Road Traffic and Public Highways Ordinance, 1966, as amended, have made the following Regulations :

FARES

1. (1) The fares which may be charged for the carriage of passengers in public vehicles are the fares specified in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- (2) A person who is the holder of a public vehicle licence shall not cause or permit the vehicle in respect of which he holds that licence to be used as a public vehicle unless there is displayed therein, in such position and in such manner as may from time to time be approved by the Committee, a notice supplied by the Committee stating the maximum fares which may be charged for the carriage of passengers in public vehicles.

GENERAL USE REQUIREMENTS

2. A person in charge of a vehicle in respect of which there is in force a public vehicle licence, shall not :
 - (i) Smoke in the vehicle during a journey when passengers are being conveyed;
 - (ii) importune any person to hire the vehicle;
 - (iii) pour petrol into or remove petrol from the vehicle whilst there is a passenger inside the vehicle;
 - (iv) refuse to carry the maximum number of passengers which the said licence permits to be carried;
 - (v) refuse to carry the luggage of the passengers in the vehicle unless the total weight of all such baggage exceeds one hundred pounds, or, by reason of the size or nature of such luggage or any part thereof, it cannot reasonably be carried in or on the vehicle;
 - (vi) charge or attempt to charge a fare or make or attempt to make a charge in excess of the fare or charge prescribed by the Schedule to these regulations.

REQUIREMENTS WHEN VEHICLE IN RESERVED AREA

3. A person, in charge of a vehicle in respect of which there is in force a public vehicle licence shall not while the vehicle is standing on the public highway in any area reserved for public vehicles :

(2) Public Vehicle Regulations ... continued

- (a) refuse an offer of hire, save that he may refuse :
 - (i) such an offer if he has good reason to believe that the fare will not be paid;
 - (ii) to carry as a passenger any person whose condition or conduct is objectionable;
- (b) leave the vehicle unattended by him for any period in excess of fifteen minutes.

CARRIAGE OF ANIMALS

- 4. A person shall not take any animal in a vehicle in respect of which there is in force a public vehicle licence without the consent of the person in charge thereof or retain any animal therein after being requested by such person in charge to remove it therefrom, or, in the case where such person in charge has consented to the animal being taken in or retained in such vehicle, place such animal elsewhere than as directed by such person in charge.

SPITTING

- 5. A person shall not while he is in a vehicle in respect of which there is in force a public vehicle licence spit in, on or from that vehicle.

INTERPRETATION

- 6. In these regulations :

"petrol" means any product used for propulsion of the vehicle; "public highway" includes any road, street, lane or public place; "public vehicle licence" means a licence granted under Section 9 of The Alderney Road Traffic and Public Highways Ordinance, 1966; and other expressions have the same meanings as in that Ordinance.

CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT


- 7. These regulations may be cited as The Public Vehicle Regulations, 1990 and shall come into force on the first day of February 1990. The Public Vehicle Regulations 1986 are hereby repealed.
