**The States of Alderney Policy & Finance Committee** (“the Committee”) in exercise of its powers under sections 2 and 3 of the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Alderney) Order, 1995(a) hereby grants the following Open General Import Licence.

1. Dairy Products comprised in the entry in Schedule 1 to the above mentioned Order may under the authority of this Licence, be imported into the Island from the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, Jersey, Guernsey and any Member States of the European Community provided they have been pasteurised in accordance with EC Regulations;
2. Dogs and Cats comprised in entry 5 in Schedule I to the above mentioned Order may, under the authority of this Licence, be imported into the Island from the United Kingdom, Jersey, Guernsey and the Isle of Man, provided that prior to importation the importer receives an Import Permit from the Committee and this Import Permit is presented to Customs on arrival in Alderney except that dogs of the type commonly known as the Pit Bull Terrier, the type of dog known as the Japanese Tosa (or Tosa) or any other type of dog which appears to have been bred for fighting are excluded from this licence;
3. (a) Feeding stuffs intended to be fed to animals;  
(b) Fertiliser intended to be spread on, or worked into the soil to increase its capacity to support plant growth containing any natural, manufactured or processed material;

- (c) Hay, straw including chaffed hay, chaffed straw and hay and straw chaffed together;
- (d) Litter including straw or any other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals;

may, under the authority of this Licence, only be imported into the Island if and prior to importation, the importer receives an Import Permit from the Committee;

4. An Import Permit issued under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 may contain such conditions as the Committee considers necessary.

  - (a) A carcass of an animal from the United Kingdom, or the Republic of Ireland, or any products made or processed therefrom prior to the 1 February 2001;
  - (b) fresh meat, meat products, minced meat and meat preparations from or using meat produced from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs from Australia; Brazil; Canada; Iceland; Liechtenstein; Namibia; New Zealand; Norway; Switzerland; USA; Uruguay subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto;
  - (c) fresh poultry meat and poultry meat products from Australia; Brazil; Canada; Iceland; Liechtenstein; Namibia; New Zealand; Norway; South Africa; Switzerland; USA; Uruguay subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto;
  - (d) fresh and fully cooked poultry meat; poultry meat products; poultry meat preparations; and meat from game birds from any Member State of the European Community, and Guernsey and Jersey subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto;
  - (e) fresh and fully cooked meat, meat products, minced meat, and meat preparations from or using meat produced from cattle, sheep, goats, pigs and game animals from Guernsey and Jersey subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto;
  - (f) fresh and fully cooked meat, meat products, minced meat, and meat preparations from or using meat produced from cattle, sheep, goats, pigs and game animals from any Member State of the European Community other than the United Kingdom, the Republic of Ireland or the Netherlands subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto;
  - (g) fully cooked meat, fully cooked meat products and fully cooked meat preparations from or using meat from cattle, sheep goats, pigs,

poultry, game animals and game birds from the United Kingdom, the Republic of Ireland and the Netherlands;

- (h) tinned meats;
- (i) pre-cooked meals; and
- (j) exotic meats.

6. For the purposes of this Statutory Instrument, in this licence, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“**carcass**” means the carcass of any animal or any part thereof;

“**cattle**” includes veal and buffalo meat;

“**exotic meats**” means the meat of alligator, kangaroo and ostrich;

“**fresh meat**” means meat that is fit for human consumption that has not undergone any preserving process other than chilling or freezing;

“**fresh poultry meat**” means any part of the carcass of poultry that is fit for human consumption that has not undergone any preserving process other than chilling or freezing;

“**fully cooked meat**” means meat subjected to heat that is sufficient to achieve a core temperature of 68°C or greater;

“**game animals**” means rabbit, hare, wild boar and deer and includes animals that have been farmed or taken from the wild;

“**game birds**” means guinea fowl, pheasant, and partridge and includes birds that have been farmed or taken from the wild;

“**meat from cattle**” includes veal and buffalo meat;

“**meat products**” means products prepared wholly or partly from meat that is fit for human consumption which has undergone a certain degree of preservation (other than chilling or freezing) and does not include meat extracts, consomme, stock or sauces;

“**meat preparations**” means fresh meat to which foodstuffs, seasonings or additives have been added;

“**minced meat**” means fresh meat minced into fragments;

“**poultry**” means domestic fowl, turkeys, geese, ducks, guinea fowl, pheasant and partridge;

“**poultry meat preparations**” means domestic fowl, turkeys, geese, ducks, guinea fowl, pheasant and partridge;

“**poultry meat products**” means products prepared wholly or partly from poultry meat that is fit for human consumption which has undergone a certain degree of preservation (other than chilling or freezing). This does not include meat extracts, consomme, stock or sauces.

7. The Open General Import Licence made the 15 March 2001(b) is hereby revoked.
8. This Licence shall come into effect on the 30 April 2001.

## SCHEDULE

The conditions attached to this licence in respect of the importation of –

**FRESH MEAT MEAT PRODUCTS, MINCED MEAT**  
**AND MEAT PREPARATIONS**

*from or using meat products from Cattle, Sheep, Goats, and pigs*

**under paragraph 5(b) are as follows:–**

**General**

All products must originate from premises in one of the countries specified in this licence that has been approved by the European Community for the export of meat or meat products into the Community

All products must be imported through a European Community Border Inspection Post before onward shipment to Alderney

Meat and meat products may transit a Member State of the European Community under the following conditions:

- consignments may be shipped to Alderney in a container under customs seal; or
- consignments imported into the Community may be broken down for onward shipment to Alderney provided that meat and meat products are:
  - (i) immediately dispatched to Alderney and not held in storage;
  - (ii) consigned in boxes or similar packaging that were sealed at the place of dispatch in a third country specified in this licence and the seals are left intact; and
  - (iii) accompanied by an original or a copy of any certification required under this licence

**Fresh meat and meat products from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:**

Fresh meat imported into Alderney must conform with all of the requirements of Directive 72/462/EEC, as amended on health and veterinary inspection problems on importing fresh meat and meat products from third countries

Each consignment must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the model health certificate in Decision 97/221/EC

**Minced meat and meat preparations made from fresh meat from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:**

Minced meat and meat preparations imported into Alderney must conform with the requirements of Decision 2000/572/EC on animal and public health conditions and veterinary certification for imports of minced meat and meat preparations from third countries

Each consignment of minced meat must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex I of that Decision

Each consignment of meat preparations must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex II of that Decision

**The conditions attached to this licence in respect of the importation of -  
FRESH POULTRY MEAT AND POULTRY MEAT PRODUCTS**

**under paragraph 5(c) are as follows:**

**Fresh Poultry meat:**

Fresh poultry meat imported into Alderney must conform with all of the requirements of Directive 91/494/EEC, as amended, on animal health conditions governing imports from third countries of fresh poultry meat

Each consignment must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Article 12 of that Directive

**Meat products made from fresh poultry meat:**

Each consignment must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the model health certificate in Decision 97/221/EC

**The conditions attached to this licence in respect of the importation of –**

**FRESH AND FULLY COOKED POULTRY MEAT  
POULTRY MEAT PRODUCTS, POULTRY MEAT  
PREPARATIONS AND MEAT FROM GAME BIRDS**

**under paragraph 5(d) are as follows:–**

**Fresh poultry meat:**

Fresh poultry meat imported into Alderney must conform with all of the requirements of Directive 71/118/EEC, as amended, on health problems affecting trade in fresh poultry meat and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter XII of Directive 91/116/EEC.

**Fresh meat from game birds:**

Fresh meat from game birds imported into Alderney must:

- in the case of farmed game birds, conform with all of the requirements of Directive 91/495/EEC, as amended, concerning public health and animal health requirements affecting the production and placing on the market of farmed game meat. Imported meat must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter III and be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex II of that Directive.
- in the case of wild game birds, conform with all of the requirements of Directive 92/45/EC on public health and animal health problems relating to the killing of wild game and the placing on the market of wild game meat.

Imported meat must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter VIII and be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter IX of that Directive.

**Meat products made from fresh poultry meat:**

Meat products imported into Alderney must conform with the requirements of Directive 77/99/EEC, as amended, on health problems affecting intra-community trade in meat products and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex B, Chapter VI of Directive 95/68/EC.

**Meat preparations made from fresh poultry meat:**

Minced meat and meat preparations imported into Alderney must conform with the requirements of Directive 94/65/EC laying down requirements for the production and placing on the market of minced meat and meat products and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter VI of that Directive.

**Fully cooked poultry meat, poultry meat products and poultry meat preparations:**

Fully cooked meat, meat products and meat preparations may be imported without restriction.

The conditions attached to this licence in respect of the importation of—

**FRESH AND FULLY COOKED MEAT, MEAT PRODUCTS,  
MINCED MEAT AND MEAT PREPARATIONS**

*from or using meat produced from cattle, sheep, goats, pigs and game animals*

under paragraph 5(e) are as follows:—

**Fully cooked meat, meat products, minced meat and meat preparations transhipped through Guernsey and Jersey:**

No restrictions.

**Fresh meat, meat products, minced meat and meat preparations transhipped through Guernsey and Jersey:**

a) from a Member State of the European Community other than the United Kingdom, Republic of Ireland or the Netherlands:

(i) **Fresh meat from cattle, sheep goats and pigs:** Fresh meat must conform with all of the requirements of Directive 64/433/EEC, as amended, on health problems affecting intra-community trade in fresh meat and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter XI of Directive 91/467/EEC;

(ii) **Fresh meat from game animals:** Fresh game meat must:

- in the case of farmed game animals, conform with all of the requirements of Directive 91/495/EEC, as amended, concerning public health and animal health requirements affecting the production and placing on the market of rabbit meat and farmed game meat. Game meat must bear a health mark that conforms

with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter III and be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex II of that Directive;

- in the case of wild game animals, conform with all of the requirements of Directive 92/45/EC on public health and animal health problems relating to the killing of wild game and the placing on the market of wild game meat. Game meat must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter VIII and be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter IX of that Directive.
- (iii) **Meat products made from fresh meat from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:** Meat products conform with the requirements of Directive 77/99/EEC, as amended, on health problems affecting intra-community trade in meat products and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex A, Chapter VII of that Directive;
- (iv) **Minced meat and meat preparations made from fresh meat from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:** Minced meat and meat preparations conform with the requirements of Directive 94/65/EC laying down requirements for the production and placing on the market of minced meat and meat preparations and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter VI of that Directive.

**NOTE:** *The above mentioned products may be imported from a Member State of the European Community (other than the United Kingdom, Republic of Ireland or the Netherlands) through the United Kingdom, Republic of Ireland or the Netherlands into Jersey or Guernsey and then into Alderney subject to the above mentioned conditions.*

b) from an Approved Country

- (i) **General:** All products must originate from premises in an Approved Country that has been approved by the European Community for the export of meat or meat products into the European Community

All products must be imported through a European Community Border Inspection Post before onward shipment to Jersey or Guernsey and then to Alderney

Meat and meat products may transit a Member State of the European Community under the following conditions:

- consignments may be shipped to Jersey or Guernsey and then to Alderney in a container under customs seal; or
- consignments imported into the Community may be broken down for onward shipment to Jersey or Guernsey and then to Alderney provided that meat and meat products are:

immediately dispatched to Jersey or Guernsey and then to Alderney and not held in storage;

consigned in boxes or similar packaging that were sealed at the place of dispatch in an Approved Country and the seals are left intact; and accompanied by an original or a copy of the certification required by EC law.

(ii) **Fresh meat and meat products from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:**

Fresh meat imported into Jersey or Guernsey and then shipped to Alderney must conform with all of the requirements of Directive 72/462/EEC, as amended, on health and veterinary inspection problems on importing fresh meat and meat products from third countries.

Each consignment must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the model health certificate in Decision 97/221/EC.

(iii) **Minced meat and meat preparations made from fresh meat from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:** Minced meat and meat preparations imported into Jersey or Guernsey and shipped to Alderney must conform with the requirements of Decision 2000/572/EC on animal and public health conditions and veterinary certification for imports of minced meat and meat preparations from third countries.

Each consignment of minced meat must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex I of that Decision.

Each consignment of meat preparations must be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex II of that Decision.

**NOTE:** *The approved countries are:–*

*Australia; Brazil; Canada; Iceland; Liechtenstein; Namibia; New Zealand; Norway; Switzerland; USA; Uruguay.*

The conditions attached to this licence in respect of the importation of -

**FRESH AND FULLY COOKED MEAT, MEAT PRODUCTS**  
**MINCED MEAT AND MEAT PREPARATIONS**

*from or using meat produced from cattle, sheep, goats, pigs and game animals*

under paragraph 5(f) are as follows:-

**Fresh meat from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:**

Fresh meat imported into Alderney must conform with all of the requirements of Directive 64/433/EEC, as amended, on health problems affecting intra-community trade in fresh meat and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter XI of Directive 91/467/EEC.

**Fresh meat from game animals:**

Fresh game meat imported into Alderney must:

- in the case of farmed game animals, conform with all of the requirements of Directive 91/495/EEC, as amended, concerning public health and animal health requirements affecting the production and placing on the market of rabbit meat and farmed game meat. Game meat must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter III and be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex II of that Directive
- in the case of wild game animals, conform with all of the requirements of Directive 92/45/EC on public health and animal health problems relating to the killing of wild game and the placing on the market of wild game meat. Game meat must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter VIII and be accompanied by a health certificate that conforms with the requirements of Annex I, Chapter IX of that Directive

**Meat products made from fresh meat from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:**

Meat products imported into Alderney must conform with the requirements of Directive 77/99/EEC, as amended, on health problems affecting intra-community trade in meat products and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex A, Chapter VII of that Directive

**Minced meat and meat preparations made from fresh meat from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:**

Minced meat and meat preparations imported into Guernsey must conform with the requirements of Directive 94/65/EC laying down requirements for the

production and placing on the market of minced meat and meat preparations and must bear a health mark that conforms with the requirements of Annex I Chapter VI of that Directive

**Fully cooked meat, meat products and meat preparations:**

Fully cooked meat, meat products and meat preparations may be imported without restriction.

**The conditions attached to this licence in respect of the importation of –**

**FULLY COOKED MEAT, FULLY COOKED MEAT PRODUCTS  
AND FULL Y COOKED MEAT PREPARA TIONS**

*from or using meat from cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, poultry, game animals and game birds*

**under paragraph 5(g) are as follows:–**

Meat, meat products and meat preparations must have been heated sufficiently to achieve a core temperature of at least 68°C. (Meat, meat products and meat preparation not heated to at least this temperature will not be classed as fully cooked)
