

GUERNSEY STATUTORY INSTRUMENT

The Public Health (Notifiable Diseases)
Order, 1985

Made 2nd October, 1985
Laid before the States ...
Coming Into Operation 7th October, 1985

THE STATES BOARD OF HEALTH, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 1(1)(b) of Article VI of the Public Health Ordinance, 1936, as amended (a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

1. The following infectious or contagious diseases, that is to say:

acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS);
brucellosis;
Lassa fever;
Marburg disease;
psittacosis;
rabies; and
viral haemorrhagic fever,

are hereby declared to be notifiable diseases within the meaning of section 1 of Article VI of the Public Health Ordinance, 1936, as amended.

2. The Public Health (Notifiable Diseases) Order, 1977 (b) is repealed.


3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 (c) applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

4. This Order shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

5. This Order may be cited as the Public Health (Notifiable Diseases) Order, 1985.

6. This Order shall come into force on the 7th day of October, 1985.
