The Post Office (Postal Order) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1982

Made 4th August, 1982

THE STATES POST OFFICE BOARD, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by sections twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-three and sixty-eight of the Post Office (Guernsey) Law, 1969, as amended (a), hereby orders:-

Amendment
to Order
of 1969.

1. The Post Office (Postal Order) Order, 1969, as amended (b) is hereby further amended as follows:-

(a) section one thereof is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor -

"1. (1) Postal orders may be issued for the denominations as specified in the Schedule to this Order.

(2) The value of a postal order may be increased by affixing postage stamps not exceeding two in number and not exceeding a total of 4.5p in value: Provided that no payment shall be made by or on behalf of the Board in respect of:-

(a) a stamp not affixed in the space provided for the purpose on the postal order; or

(b) a stamp which is not a stamp for the time being authorised or required to be used for the purpose of the States Post Office, or

(c) a stamp which has been cut out of any postal packet, document, instrument, envelope or other cover, or which is perforated with initials or marks.";

(b) subsection (2) of section nine thereof is repealed and the following subsection is substituted therefor -

"(2) In relation to postal orders issued at any post office under the charge of the postal administration of a country outside the Bailiwick, being a post office where postal orders are issued under such an arrangement as mentioned in section thirty-three of the Law, the following subsection shall be substituted for subsection (2) of section one of this Order:-

"(2) The value of a postal order may be increased by affixing, in the space provided for the purpose, postage stamps not exceeding two in number and not exceeding a total of 4.5p in value or the equivalent in the currency of the country in which the postal order is issued. Any such stamp may either be a stamp authorised or required to be used for the purpose of the States Post Office or, if the postal administration of the country in which the postal order is issued so allows, a current stamp for denoting a rate of postage of that country, but no other stamps may be used. If a stamp is affixed in contravention of the provisions of this subsection no payment shall be made by or on behalf of the Board in respect of that stamp."";

(c) subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section nine thereof is repealed and the following subparagraph is substituted therefor -

"(ii) the stamps affixed to any such postal order do not exceed two in number and do not exceed a total of 4.5p in value;"

(d) the Schedule thereto is repealed and the Schedule set out in the Schedule to this order is substituted therefor.

Repeals.

2. The Post Office (Postal Order) (Amendment) Order, 1971[✓](c), the Post Office (Postal Order) (Amendment) Order[✓] 1980(d) the Post Office (Postal Order) (Amendment) Order, 1981[✓](e) and the Post Office (Postal Order) (Amendment) Order, 1982[✓](f), are hereby repealed.


Citation.
