THE COMMITTEE FOR HOME AFFAIRS, convening as THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 5 of the Traffic Offences (Fixed Penalties) Ordinance, 1989 (a), hereby orders:-

Manner and  
place of  
fixed

payments.

1. A fixed penalty must be paid either in cash or by a postal order, money order or cheque payable to the States of Guernsey, and must be delivered -

(a) by post (which, in the case of a payment in cash, means registered post) to the States Treasurer, States Office, St. Peter Port, Guernsey; or

(b) in person either at -

(i) the States Office, North Esplanade, St. Peter Port, Guernsey; or


(ii) the States Post Office, Smith Street, St. Peter Port, Guernsey.

Meaning of  
"fixed  
penalty"

2. In this Order "fixed penalty" means a fixed penalty whose payment in accordance with the Traffic Offences (Fixed Penalties) Ordinance, 1989, discharges any liability to conviction of an offence particularised in a fixed penalty notice issued under section 2 of that Ordinance.

- Repeal 3. The Fixed Penalties Order, 1989, (b) is hereby  
repealed.
- Citation. 4. This Order may be cited as the Fixed Penalties  
Order, 1992.
- Commencement. 5. This Order shall come into operation on the 2nd  
November, 1992.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order specifies the manner in which, and the places at which, a fixed penalty is to be paid. Principally, it includes the States Post Office in Smith Street, in addition to the States Office, North Esplanade, as a place at which fixed penalties may be paid in person with effect from 2 November, 1992.
