**The Social Insurance (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit)
(Amendment) Regulations, 1998**

Made 22nd October, 1998

Laid before the States

Coming into operation 26th October, 1998

THE GUERNSEY SOCIAL SECURITY AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 23 of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1978, as amended^a, hereby orders:-

Amendment

1. Paragraph (3) of regulation 6 of the Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit(Guernsey) Regulations, as amended^b, is deleted and replaced by the following:

“(3) For the purposes of unemployment benefit, where a person is an employed person and his employment as such has not been terminated, then in any week a day shall not be treated as a day of unemployment unless the total number of such days in that week is three or more.”

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 26th October 1998.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations relate to the payment of unemployment benefit for periods of short-time working. They replace the current rather complicated, provision relating to the non-payment of benefit for a day not normally worked with a simpler one which has much the same effect, that there must be a total of three days of unemployment, including the non-working day, before benefit becomes payable.
