THE IMMIGRATION (GUERNSEY) (AMENDMENT) RULES 1988

Made..... 27 September 1988
Laid before the States.....
Coming into Operation..... 28 September 1988

THE STATES BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sub-section (2) of Section Three of the Immigration Act 1971, as extended to the Bailiwick by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order 1972, as varied by the Immigration (Guernsey) (Variation) Order 1982, and the Criminal Justice Act 1982 (Guernsey) Order 1983, hereby makes the following Rules:-

1. Amendment to Rules of 1983.

The Immigration (Guernsey) Rules 1983 (a) as amended (b, c, d and e) are hereby further amended as follows:-

- (1) the following paragraph shall be substituted for Paragraph 21:-

"21. A passenger admitted to the Bailiwick of Guernsey as a visitor, and any dependants accompanying him, should be given leave to enter for a period of six months unless the Immigration Officer is satisfied that there are particular circumstances which justify the giving of a shorter period of leave. Visitors should normally be prohibited from taking employment." ;

- (2) in Paragraph 75 the words "paragraph 187 (visitors)" in sub-paragraph (b) shall be deleted ;
- (3) in Paragraph 97 the words "or longer" shall be deleted ; and
- (4) in Paragraph 98 the words "one year" there shall be substituted the words "six months".
