THE STATES BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 46(1) and (2)(a) of the Harbours Ordinance, 1988^a, hereby makes the following regulations:-


Use of visiting yacht facilities

1. A person other than a visiting yachtsman shall not, without the permission of the Harbourmaster, enter a visiting yacht facility in either harbour.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations-

“visiting yacht” means a boat for the purposes of the Boats and Vessels (Registration, Speed Limits and Abatement of Noise) Ordinance, 1970^b which is not registered under Part I of that Ordinance;

“visiting yacht facility” means a building equipped with showers, toilets or laundry facilities provided for the use of visiting yachtsmen and bearing a notice to that effect;

“visiting yachtsman” means a person who is the owner of, or crewman or passenger on, a visiting yacht;

and any other expression shall have the same meaning as in the Harbours Ordinance, 1988.


Citation

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Harbours (Visiting Yacht Facilities) Regulations, 2001.

Commencement

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the 16th day of August, 2001.
