
ALDERNEY STATUTORY INSTRUMENT

No. 25 — 2001

The Traffic (Amendment) Regulations, 2001

The States of Alderney General Purposes Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in it by the States and by Section 2 of the Alderney Road Traffic and Public Highways Ordinance, 1966 have made the following Regulations:—

1. The Traffic Regulations, 1986, as amended, are further amended as follows:—

Delete Regulation 14A and replace with the following —

- “14A (1) A “disabled people’s parking place” is a place on which the Committee has erected and/or marked a sign indicating that it is reserved for parking by disabled people;
- (2) Such a sign may reserve a place for parking by disabled people at all times, or only between specified times, and in the latter event may impose some other control over parking at times when the place is not so reserved;
 - (3) A person shall not park a vehicle in a disabled people’s parking place unless:
 - (a) he or his passenger being carried in the vehicle is the holder of a currently valid disabled driver’s badge (“a badge”) issued by the Committee under the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Regulation; or
 - (b) he or his passenger being carried in the vehicle is the holder of a currently valid disabled driver’s badge issued by a recognised authority in the European Union;

and unless that badge is prominently displayed inside the windscreen of the vehicle.

- (4) (i) The Committee shall be empowered to issue upon application a badge in a form it prescribes for display on motor vehicles driven by or used for the carriage of a

person suffering from some physical defect or disability (“a disabled person”).

- (ii) Before a badge is issued the Committee shall be empowered to require such evidence of disability as it may deem necessary in any particular case.
- (iii) The words “some physical defect or disability” in this Regulation mean such condition that the Committee may recognise for the purpose of issuing a badge.
- (iv) A badge may be issued to a disabled person in respect of any one or more vehicles and, if so issued, may be displayed on it or any of them at times when the vehicle is being driven by him.
- (v) A badge may be issued to a disabled person in respect of one or more vehicles used by him as a passenger and may be displayed on it or any of such vehicles at times when being used to carry him.
- (vi) The Committee may issue a badge to an institution concerned in the care of disabled persons within the Island for any motor vehicle, or, as the case may be, for each motor vehicle kept within the island for the institution to carry disabled persons, and any badge so issued may be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it applies when it is being used to carry disabled persons.
- (vii) The Committee shall maintain a register showing the details of holders of badges issued under this regulation and the vehicles in respect of which the badges are held.
- (viii) A badge issued under this regulation shall remain the property of the Committee and be issued for such period and subject to such conditions as the Committee sees fit.
- (ix) A badge issued under this regulation shall be delivered up forthwith when the Committee so requires and any person who without reasonable excuse fails to comply with such a requirement shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the Alderney uniform scale.

- (x) Any person who knowingly makes a false declaration or statement in or in connection with an application under this regulation for a badge shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding level 4 on the Alderney uniform scale.
 - (xi) Any person who with intent to deceive uses a badge issued under this regulation other than in accordance with the provisions of this regulation, or any other enactment for the time being in force regulating the use of such badges, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding level 4 on the Alderney uniform scale.
- (5) If a disabled people's parking place is in a disc zone any disabled person who parks there must also comply with Regulation 14 of these Regulations.”
2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1 948(a) applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applied to the interpretation of an enactment in force in the Island of Guernsey.
 3. These Regulations may be cited as “The Traffic (Amendment) Regulations, 2001” and shall come into force on the first day of August 2001.
