The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 4)  
Regulations, 1974

Made the 28th day of June, 1974.

Coming into operation on the 2nd day of July, 1974.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along that section of the eastern end of Bouillon Lane, St Peter Port, between the premises known as Green Triangle and the south-eastern end of the Jamaica Inn car park, otherwise than from south-east to north-west.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 4) Regulations, 1974.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the second day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy-four, and shall continue in force until the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seventy-five.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the 2nd July, 1974, that section of Bouillon Lane, St Peter Port, between the premises known as Green Triangle and the south-eastern end of the car park of the Jamaica Inn, will be a one-way street, traffic in that section being required to travel from the direction of St. George's Esplanade towards Le Bouet.
