The Non-Business Days Order, 1993

Made 15th October, 1993

Coming into operation 16th October, 1993

THE STATES ADVISORY AND FINANCE COMMITTEE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 1(1) of the Bills of Exchange (Guernsey) Law, 1958, as amended(a), hereby makes the following order:-

Non-business days

1. In section 1(1) of the Bills of Exchange (Guernsey) Law, 1958, the expression "non-business day" shall mean-

- (a) a Saturday, a Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday;
- (b) in relation to the Bailiwick excluding the Islands of Alderney and Sark, a day appointed as a public holiday by Ordinance of the States of Guernsey under the said section 1(1);
- (c) in relation to the Island of Alderney, a day appointed as a public holiday by Ordinance of the States of Alderney under the said section 1(1) or under paragraph (o) of Schedule 2 to the Government of Alderney Law, 1987(b);
- (d) in relation to the Island of Sark, a day appointed as a public holiday by Ordinance of the Chief Pleas under the said section 1(1);
- (e) a day declared to be a non-business day by an order which has effect in the Bailiwick by virtue of section 1(1) of the Banking and Financial Dealings (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1972(c).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This order defines the expression "non-business day" for the purposes of the Bills of Exchange (Guernsey) Law, 1958. The definition applies throughout the Bailiwick.
