

The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 6)
Regulations, 1974

Made the 16th day of July, 1974.

Coming into operation on the 19th day of July, 1974.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (b) of section one of the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970 (c), a person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal may drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along Les Amballes, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Saint Clement's Road to its junction with Well Road, from south to north.

2. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along Saint John's Road, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from east to west.

3. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No. 6) Regulations, 1974.

5. These Regulations shall come into force on the nineteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy-four and shall continue in force until the eighteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and seventy-five.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the 19th July, 1974:-

- (a) that portion of Les Amballes, between its junction with Saint Clement's Road and its junction with Well Road, shall be open to two-way traffic;
- (b) Saint John's Road, Saint Peter Port, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in the direction of Rouge Rue.
