The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No. 2) Regulations, 1982

Made the 1st day of February, 1982.

Coming into operation on the 8th day of February, 1982.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Ordinance entitled "The Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950" (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (b) of section one of the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970 (c), a person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal -

(a) shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along that portion of Upland Road, from its junction with Candie Road to its junction with Monument Road, otherwise than from north to south;

(b) may drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along that portion of Upland Road, Saint Peter Port from its junction with Monument Road to its southern junction with Monument Garden Road, from north to south.

2. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along that portion of Candie Road from its junction with Monument Road to its junction with Upland Road, other than from north-west to south-east.

3. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along Monument Road, Saint Peter Port otherwise than from east to west.

4. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article 1 of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en Cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine:

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

5. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No. 2) Regulations, 1982.

6. These Regulations shall come into force on the eighth day of February, nineteen hundred and eighty-two and shall continue in force until the seventh day of August, nineteen hundred and eighty-two.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from 8 February 1982 :-

1. the portion of Upland Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Grange Road to the entrance to Monument Garden Road will continue to be a one-way street as required by the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970, traffic being required to proceed from the direction of its junction with Grange Road towards the first, or southern, junction with Monument Garden Road;
2. two-way traffic will be restored in the portion of Upland Road which lies between the entrance to Monument Garden Road and its junction with Monument Road;
3. the portion of Upland Road which lies between its junction with Monument Road and its junction with Candie Road will continue to be a one-way street but traffic will be required to proceed from the direction of its junction with Candie Road towards its junction with Monument Road instead of in the opposite direction, as required by the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970;
4. the portion of Candie Road in which one-way traffic is required by the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970 will be extended to include that portion of Candie Road which lies between its junction with Monument Road and its junction with Upland Road, traffic being required to proceed in the direction of Saint Julian's Avenue;
5. Monument Road, Saint Peter Port, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to travel from the direction of its junction with Upland Road towards its junction with Candie Road.
