The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1981

Made the 22nd day of January, 1981.

Repealed 1981/11

Coming into operation on the 2nd day of February, 1981.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Ordinance entitled "The Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950" (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along that portion of Le Rocher Road, Saint Martin, which lies between the eastern entry to Blanchelande College and its junction with Les Aubrets, otherwise than from east to west.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1981.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the second day of February, nineteen hundred and eighty-one and shall continue in force until the first day of August, nineteen hundred and eighty-one.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from 2nd February, 1981, that portion of Le Rocher Road, Saint Martin, which lies between the lower or eastern driveway to Blanchelande College and its junction with Les Aubrets, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed from the direction of its junction with the Rue du Moulin towards its junction with Les Aubrets.
