THE IMMIGRATION (CONTROL OF ENTRY THROUGH REPUBLIC OF IRELAND)

(AMENDMENT)(GUERNSEY)(NO.1) ORDER 1982

Made ..21st December..1982:.....

Coming into Operation 1st January 1983

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 9(2) and (6) of the Immigration Act 1971(a) as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order 1972(b), I hereby make the following order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland)(Amendment)(Guernsey)(No.1) Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1983.
2. In Article 4(1) of the Immigration (Control of Entry through the Republic of Ireland)(Guernsey)(No.1) Order 1972(c) for the words "any person who is not patrial" there shall be substituted the words "any person who does not have the right of abode in the United Kingdom under Section 2 of the Act"(d).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article 4(1) of the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland) (Guernsey)(No.1) Order 1972 provides that certain persons who are not patrial and who enter the Bailiwick of Guernsey from the Republic of Ireland after coming from a place outside the Common Travel Area or after leaving the Bailiwick of Guernsey while having a limited leave to enter or remain there which has expired are subject to certain restrictions and conditions as to the period for which they may remain. By virtue of amendments made to the Immigration Act 1971 as extended to the Bailiwick by Section 39 of and Schedule 4 to the British Nationality Act 1981 (C61) which comes into force on 1st January 1983 (UK S.I. 1982 No.933) the term "patrial" no longer has any meaning. This order amends Article 4(1) in consequence of those amendments.
