**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying)
(Bailiwick of Guernsey) Regulations, 2001**

12th September, 2001

Coming into operation

Forthwith

THE STATES BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the Bailiwick of Guernsey.


Now, therefore, the Board of Administration, in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 66 of the Air Navigation Order 1980 as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Air Navigation (Guernsey) Order, 1981 and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations:

1. These restrictions may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Regulations 2001 and shall come into force forthwith.
2. All times referred to in these Regulations are Co-ordinated Universal Time.
3. (1) Subject to paragraph (2), no aircraft shall, from the time these Regulations come into force until 19.00 hours on 12th September 2001, fly into the airspace of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or take off from any place in the Bailiwick of Guernsey other than one operated under and in accordance with an air operator's certificate or a police air operators certificate granted to the operator by the state of

registry of the aircraft or the state of the operator.

(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to an aircraft flying with the permission of the Manager, Air Traffic Control Guernsey.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These regulations prohibit (subject to the granting of exemptions) all flights by private aircraft within the Bailiwick of Guernsey (including territorial waters) until 19.00 hours CUT on the 12th September.
