The Social Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1977

Made 23rd September, 1977

Coming into Operation 21st November 1977

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections thirty-eight and seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment of regulations two and three of the principal regulations

1. In regulations two and three of the Social Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1969, as amended, the words "one pound and seventy-five new pence", wherever they occur, are hereby repealed and the words "two pounds and twenty-five new pence" are hereby substituted therefor.

Repeal

2. The Social Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1976, are hereby repealed.


Citation, collective title and commencement

3.(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1977.

(2) These regulations and the Social Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1969 and 1971, may be cited together as the Social Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1969 to 1977.

(3) These regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of November, nineteen hundred and seventy-seven.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations further amend the Social Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1969, as amended, so as to provide that the weekly rate of personal benefit or dependency benefit adjusted under those Regulations in the case of a beneficiary or of a dependant of a beneficiary being maintained free of charge in the Castel Hospital should be increased to two pounds and twenty-five pence.
