

The Fishing (Prohibition Of Importation Of Ormers) Order, 1999*Made*28th September, 1999*Laid before the States*

, 1999

Coming into Operation on28th September, 1999

THE STATES SEA FISHERIES COMMITTEE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 15(1) of the Fishing Ordinance, 1997(a), hereby orders:-

Prohibition on importation of ormers

1. (1) Subject to paragraph (2), no person shall import-
 - (a) any ormers of the species *Haliotis tuberculata* (commonly known as ormers), whether dead or alive; or
 - (b) any eggs or larvae of such ormers.
- (2) This sections does not apply to preserved ormers.

Interpretation.

2. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise provides, “**preserved ormers**” shall have the same meaning as in the Fishing Ordinance, 1997.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948(b) applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

Citation.

3. This Order may be cited as the Fishing (Prohibition of Importation of Ormers) Order, 1999.
