THE IRIS (CONTROL OF IMPORTATION FROM JERSEY) ORDER, 1986

Made 17th Day of November 1986

Coming into Operation 24th Day of November 1986

Laid before the States

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR HORTICULTURE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section thirteen of the Import and Export (Plant Health) Ordinance, 1982, as amended (a), hereby orders:-

1. The landing in any of the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou of bulbs of the plant Iris of Jersey origin is hereby prohibited unless the bulbs are accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate relating to them.
2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 (b), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
3. This Order may be cited as the Iris (Control of Importation from Jersey) Order, 1986.
4. This Order shall come into force on the twenty-fourth day of November nineteen hundred and eighty six

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

The purpose of this Order is to introduce a need for phytosanitary certification for the importation into this Island (including Heron and Jethou) of bulbs of the plant Iris of Jersey origin as part of control measures to prevent the introduction of the non-indigenous disease known as *Ditylenchus destructor* (Potato Tuber Nematode).
