The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 3)
Regulations, 1989.

Made: 27 October, 1989.

Coming into operation: 1 November, 1989.


THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Vehiculaire en cette Ile" of 2 March, 1929 (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating vehicular traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission in writing of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed along Le Pouquelah, Castel, from its junction with La Rue Traversee to its junction with the Saumarez Park entrance (West Gate), otherwise than from North to South.
2. In these Regulations:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Vehiculaire en cette Ile" on 2 March 1929;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.
3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 3) Regulations, 1989.
4. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1 day of November, 1989 and shall continue in force until the 27 day of April, 1990.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The effect of these Regulations is that from the 1 November, 1989, to 27 April, 1990, Le Pouquelah, Castel, will be a one-way street, with traffic being required to travel from the direction of its junction with La Rue Traversee towards its junction with the Saumarez Park entrance (West Gate).
