The Road Traffic (Clearway) (No. 4) Regulations, 1983

Made the 13th day of December, 1983.

Coming into operation on the 19th day of December, 1983.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950, (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, cause or permit that vehicle or animal to wait on any part of the carriageway of that portion of the Bordage, Saint Peter Port, which lies between Trinity Square and its junction with Tower Hill, otherwise than to permit pedestrians to cross at the pedestrian crossing, on any day other than a Sunday or a Bank Holiday, between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon and half past five in the afternoon.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Clearway) (No. 4) Regulations, 1983.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the nineteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and eighty-three and shall continue in force until the eighteenth day of June, nineteen hundred and eighty-four.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a further period of six months, from 19th December, 1983, the portion of the Bordage, Saint Peter Port, between Trinity Square and Tower Hill, will continue to be a clearway but traffic will now be prohibited to stop otherwise than to permit pedestrians to cross at the pedestrian crossing, on any day other than a Sunday or Bank Holiday, between the hours of 8 am and 5.30 pm.
