The Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 2006

THE SOCIAL SECURITY DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 1, 98 and 116 of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1978, as amended^a, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment

1. In paragraph (2) of Regulation 4 of the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1978^b for the word "five" there is substituted the word "thirteen".

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^c applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 2006.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations amend the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1978 by increasing the period of absence from Guernsey, required to extinguish liability to pay Class 2 and Class 3 contributions, from 5 weeks to 13 weeks; and thus providing that a self-employed, or non-employed person, who is ordinarily resident in Guernsey shall continue to be liable to pay a weekly contribution throughout a temporary absence from the Island of less than 13 weeks.
