**THE GUERNSEY SOCIAL SECURITY AUTHORITY**, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 28, 67 and 116 of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1978, as amended<sup>1</sup>, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

**Amendment**

1. In Regulation 6(2)(b) of the Social Insurance (Residence and Persons Abroad) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1978, as amended<sup>2</sup>,
  - (a) the full stop is replaced by “; or”; and
  - (b) there is added:

“

  - (c) (i) she was resident and present in Guernsey 16 weeks before the date on which it was expected that she would be confined; and
  - (ii) during the absence she has not become insurable under the legislation of another country.”

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations allow a woman who would have been able to claim maternity allowance in Guernsey, and thus to continue to receive it whilst abroad, to make her claim to Guernsey after arrival in another country.
