THE IMMIGRATION (CONTROL OF ENTRY THROUGH REPUBLIC OF IRELAND)

(AMENDMENT) (GUERNSEY) ORDER 1981

Made 3 February 1981

Laid before the States

Coming into Operation 4 February 1981

THE STATES BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section 9(2) of the Immigration Act 1971 (a), as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order 1972 (b), hereby orders:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland)(Amendment)(Guernsey) Order 1981 and shall come into operation on 4 February 1981:..... .
2. Article 3(4) of the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland)(Guernsey)(No.2) Order 1972 (c) is hereby repealed and the following Article substituted therefore:-
 - 3(4) The condition referred to in paragraph (3) is to the effect that:-
 - (a) unless he is a national of a state which is a member of the European Community, he shall not engage in any occupation for reward, and
 - (b) unless he is a national of a state which is a member of the European Community other than Greece, he shall not engage in any employment.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

Article 3(4) of the Immigration (Control of Entry through Republic of Ireland)(Guernsey) (No.2) Order 1972 provides, that certain persons who are not patrial and who enter the Bailiwick of Guernsey from the Republic of Ireland after coming from a place outside the Common Travel Area or after leaving the Bailiwick of Guernsey while having a limited leave to enter or remain there which has since expired are prohibited from taking up employment or any occupation for reward, except where they are nationals of States who are Members of the European Economic Community. This Order amends Article 3(4) so as to provide that nationals of Greece (which became a Member of the Community on 1 January 1981) who enter the Bailiwick of Guernsey in these circumstances are prohibited from taking employment but not from taking up an occupation for reward.
