THE PREVENTION OF TERRORISM (SUPPLEMENTAL TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) (AMENDMENT) (GUERNSEY) Order 1979

Made 17th April, 1979
Laid before the States
Coming into Operation 18th April, 1979

THE STATES EMERGENCY COUNCIL, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 13 and 14(5) and (6) of and paragraph 1(8) of Schedule 3 to the Prevention of Terrorism (Temporary Provisions) Act 1976 as extended to the Bailiwick by the Prevention of Terrorism (Temporary Provisions) Act 1976 (Guernsey) Order 1976, hereby order:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Prevention of Terrorism (Supplemental Temporary Provisions) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Order 1979 and shall come into operation on the 18th day of April, 1979.

Amendment to Order of 1976


2. For paragraph (1) of Article 10 of the Prevention of Terrorism (Supplemental Temporary Provisions) (Guernsey) Order 1976 there shall be substituted the following paragraph:-

"(1) A person who may be required to submit to examination under Article 5 may be detained, under the authority of an examining officer, pending his examination or pending consideration of the question whether to make an exclusion order against him for a period not exceeding

48 hours:

Provided that the Lieutenant Governor may, in any particular case, extend the period of 48 hours by a further period not exceeding 5 days."

This Order amends Article 10 of the Prevention of Terrorism (Supplemental Temporary Provisions) (Guernsey) Order, 1976 so as to reduce the maximum period for which a person who may be examined under Article 5 of the Order may be detained under the authority of an examining officer to a period of 48 hours, except that that period may be extended in a particular case by the Lieutenant Governor by a further period not exceeding 5 days.
