THE STATES BOARD OF HEALTH, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section one of Article VI of the Public Health Ordinance, 1936, as amended(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

1. The following infectious or contagious diseases, that is to say:-

- brucellosis;
- Lassa fever;
- Marburg disease;
- psittacosis;
- rabies; and
- viral haemorrhagic fever;

are hereby declared to be notifiable diseases within the meaning of section one of Article VI of the Public Health Ordinance, 1936, as amended.

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948(b), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

3. The Public Health (Notifiable Diseases) Order, 1974(c), and the Public Health (Notifiable Diseases) Order, 1976(d), are hereby repealed.

4. This Order shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

5. This Order may be cited as the Public Health (Notifiable Diseases) Order, 1977.

6. This Order shall come into force on the twenty-second day of February, nineteen hundred and seventy-seven.
