Import and Export (Control) (Alderney) Law, 1946

**The Prohibition of Import (Foot and Mouth Disease
Emergency provisions) Order, 2001**

Made	1st March, 2001
Coming into force	1st March, 2001

The Policy & Finance Committee in pursuance of the powers conferred by Article 1 of the Import and Export (Control) (Alderney) Law, 1946(a) hereby orders:—

1. (1) The importation into the Island of any live animal from the United Kingdom is prohibited.
- (2) The prohibition in subsection (1) shall not apply to a guide dog for the blind or hard of hearing, provided it has been granted an exemption certificate by the Committee.
2. (1) The importation into the Island from the United Kingdom of any carcass of an animal including any products made or processed therefrom, and fertilisers or animal feeding stuffs which contain meat or bone meal from an animal is prohibited;
- (2) The prohibition in subsection 1 shall not apply to:-
 - (a) a carcass of any animal or any products made or processed therefrom prior to the 1 February 2001;
 - (b) fertilisers or feeding stuffs processed prior to 1 February 2001;
 - (c) the carcass of, or any product made or processed from poultry;

- (d) fully cooked meats or products containing fully cooked meats;
 - (e) tinned meats;
 - (f) pre-cooked meals; and
 - (g) exotic meats.
3. The importation into the Island of hay, straw and litter from the United Kingdom is prohibited.
 4. (1) The importation into the Island from the United Kingdom of any milk or other dairy product is prohibited;
 - (2) The Prohibition in subsection (1) shall not apply to milk which has been pasteurised at a temperature of at least 71.7 °C for 15 seconds or to milk products made from milk pasteurised according to the specifications set out above.
 5. In this Order the following meanings shall apply:-
 - “**animal**” means all animals except fish, crustaceans, meal worms, stick insects, dressed rabbit and dressed game birds;
 - “**carcass**” means the carcass of any animal or any part thereof;
 - “**committee**” means the Policy and Finance Committee;
 - “**exotic meats**” means meat from ostrich, kangaroo and alligator;
 - “**feeding stuffs**” means bone flour, bone meal, meat meal, dried blood, greaves and similar feeding stuffs of animal origin and compound feeding stuffs containing any such animal products;
 - “**fertiliser**” means hair, bones, bone meal, bone flour, meat meal, hooves, hoof meal, hoof shavings, horns, horn meal, horn shavings, greaves, tankage, blood, dried blood, blood meal and similar fertilisers of animal origin, and compound fertilisers containing any such animal products;
 - “**hay and straw**” includes chaffed hay and chaffed straw and hay and straw chaffed together;
 - “**litter**” means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals;
 - “**poultry**” means any chicken, goose, turkey, duck or guinea fowl.
 6. This Order may be cited as The Prohibition of Import (Foot and Mouth Disease Emergency provisions) Order, 2001,
 7. The Prohibition of Import (Animals, Meat, Animal Feed, etc) (No3) Order, 2001 is hereby revoked.

8. This Order which supplements The Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Alderney) Order, 1995 shall come into force on 1 March 2001.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This order prohibits the importation of animal carcasses, fertilisers and animal feeding stuffs, hay, straw, and litter from the United Kingdom.

Those measures are introduced as a precautionary measure following an outbreak of Foot and Mouth Disease in the United Kingdom .
