**The Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) (Amendment) Regulations, 1997**

**THE GUERNSEY SOCIAL SECURITY AUTHORITY**, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 14 and 35 of the Health Service (Benefit) (Guernsey) Law, 1990(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

**Amendments**

1. (a) For the Second Schedule to The Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) Regulations, 1990(b), substitute the provisions set out in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

(b) For the Third Schedule to the Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) Regulations, 1990(b), substitute the provisions set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

**Citation**

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers)(Amendment) Regulations, 1997.

**Commencement**

3. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1997.

Additional dispensing fees payable in respect of pharmaceutical benefit supplied on a prescription endorsed "URGENT" or "DISPENSED URGENTLY" in accordance with Regulation 3 of these Regulations.

On any day, other than a non-business day, between the time the premises of the authorised supplier are closed for the supply of pharmaceutical benefit and 11pm	£14.85
On a non-business day, between 9am and 11pm, except whilst the premises are open for the purposes of any scheme prepared by the Authority under Section 12(3)(d) of the Law	£18.77
On any day between 11pm and 9am the next day or such earlier time at which the premises are opened for the supply of pharmaceutical benefit (on any day except a non-business day)	£18.77

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### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations,  
but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations further amend the Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) Regulations, 1990, as amended, by increasing the graduated fees paid to pharmacists not employed by a medical practice, by increasing the rates of additional dispensing fees payable in respect of pharmaceutical benefit and by increasing the additional dispensing fees payable in respect of pharmaceutical benefit supplied on a prescription endorsed "URGENT" or "DISPENSED URGENTLY".
