THE IMPORT DUTIES (BAILIWICK OF GUERNSEY)

(QUOTA RELIEF) (PAPER, PAPERBOARD AND PRINTED PRODUCTS) ORDER, 1979

THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section twenty one of the Customs and Excise (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1972 hereby orders:-

1. In this Order -

"the Agreements" means the Agreements, signed on 22nd July 1972, between the European Economic Community and, respectively, Sweden and Switzerland, the Agreement, signed on 14 May 1973, between the Community and Norway and the Agreement, signed on 5 October 1973, between the Community and Finland (a); references to goods originating in any of the above-mentioned countries are references to products which, under the provisions of the Agreements, are to be regarded as originating there.

2. (1) No import duty shall be charged on the relevant quota of goods which -

- (a) fall within a heading or subheading of the common customs tariff of the European Community, specified in the third column of the Schedule hereto,
- (b) are of a description specified in the first column of that Schedule in relation to the heading or subheading and
- (c) originate in the country specified in the fourth column of that Schedule.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the "relevant quota" of goods of a description specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto is the quantity of goods specified in the second column of that Schedule in relation to the description (such quantity being expressed as a number of tonnes) and any entry in the second column of the Schedule prescribing a limit to a subclass of goods within a quota shall have effect.

(3) Goods shall be treated as forming part of a quota in the order in which they are entered for home use (within the meaning of the Customs and Excise (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1972).

3. A description of goods in the first column of the Schedule hereto, other than one covering a whole heading or subheading shall be taken to comprise all goods which would be classified under a description in the same terms constituting a subheading in the relevant heading of the common customs tariff of the European Community.
4. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.
5. (1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Quota Relief)(Paper, Paperboard and Printed Products) Order, 1979.  
(2) This Order shall operate from the beginning of 1 January, 1979 up to and including 31 December, 1979.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order provides for the opening and administration during 1979 of duty-free tariff quotas for certain paper products originating in Sweden, Switzerland, Norway and Finland, established in accordance with the Agreements between the European Economic Community and those countries. Goods which form part of these tariff quotas do so in the order in which they are entered for home use.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order provides, with effect from 6 February 1979, the following increased allowances for passengers entering the Bailiwick.

- (a) for goods obtained duty and tax free in the EEC, or duty and tax free on a ship or aircraft, or obtained outside the EEC, the allowance for goods other than tobacco products and alcoholic drinks will be increased from £10 to £28.
  
- (b) for goods obtained duty and tax paid in the EEC the allowance for goods other than tobacco products and alcoholic drinks will be increased from £50 to £120.

These increases give effect to agreements recently reached among the Member States of the European Community in Brussels.
