

STATUTORY INSTRUMENT NO 4 OF 1994

STATES OF ALDERNEY

The Rabies (Alderney) (Amendment) Order, 1994

Made: 9th September 1994

Laid before the States: 2nd November 1994

Coming into operation: 9th September 1994

The States Agricultural and Fisheries Committee, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 1 and 7(2) of the Rabies (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1975(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment to 1976 Order

1. In section 1(2) of the Rabies (Alderney) Order, 1976, as amended(b), for the proviso substitute:-

"Provided that, where such an animal has been brought to that place from a place outside those countries (other than a place in the Islands), the said prohibition shall apply to that animal unless-

(a) it is a cat or dog which was subject to a commercial transaction and was imported into the United Kingdom or the Republic of


(b) Amended by the Rabies (Alderney) (Amendment) Orders 1984 and 1987.

Ireland from another member state in accordance with the provisions of Article 10(3) of Council Directive 92/65/EEC, or

(b) in any other case, it has been detained and isolated in quarantine in one or more of the said countries for a period of, or consecutive periods amounting in the aggregate to, not less than six calendar months."

2. This order has effect in the Island of Alderney.
3. This order may be cited as the Rabies (Alderney) (Amendment) Order, 1987.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The purpose of this Order is to allow the importation of cats and dogs into Alderney from member states of the European Union provided that they were commercially traded animals that had first been imported into the

United Kingdom or the Republic of Ireland in accordance with the provisions of Council Directive 92/65/EEC.

Such animals that fail any of the conditions of that directive on entry into the United Kingdom or Republic of Ireland will require to have been placed on quarantine in those countries before entry into Alderney.

This Order does not affect the existing arrangements for the movement of pet animals.
