THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1971

AMENDMENT TO OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

The Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 3 of the Import and Export of Goods (Control) Order 1971(a) hereby further modifies the Open General Import Licence granted by the said Board on the 11 November 1975(b) and modified upon the 23 December 1975(c), as follows:-

1. In Schedule 1 the entries relating to Tariff Headings 71.12, 71.13, 99.05 and 99.06 shall be deleted and the following entries shall be substituted therefor:-

"ex 71.12 Gold medals, gold medallions, gold tablets and
ex 71.13 other such gold pieces in pictorial relief or bearing inscriptions, manufactured after 1937, other than those weighing not more than 8 grammes each and of a value not exceeding £15 each c.i.f. W

ex 99.05 Gold coins minted after 1937; gold medals, gold medallions, gold tablets and other such gold pieces in pictorial relief or bearing inscriptions, manufactured after 1937, other than those weighing not more than 8 grammes each and of a value not exceeding £15 each c.i.f. W".

2. The amendment to the Open General Import Licence granted by the Board of Administration on the 11 November 1975, made by the Board on the 23 December 1975, is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Instrument)

This Instrument further modifies the Open General Import Licence of the 11 November 1975.

Gold coins, medals, medallions, tablets and other gold pieces of numismatic and other interest minted or manufactured in or before 1937, and similar items being antiques of an age exceeding one hundred years may now be imported under the authority of the Open General Import Licence.
